### **Director's Message**

In 2021, we have once again found ourselves in the midst of fighting for normalcy. No stranger to challenges, the Shine On! committee again figured out how to adapt. We couldn't talk about the importance of character if we didn't apply it ourselves!

By being adaptable and optimistic, we secured a national opportunity with NASA that even they had never experienced. We proposed a virtual conference for Pre-K to 8th-grade students throughout New York State to encourage kids to enter STEM fields by showing students how character strengths can help them reach the stars. In our conference entitled, "Look to the Stars: #CharacterCountdown," we reached almost 6,250 children in 350 classrooms throughout the state in a three-week program that consisted of workshops and resources about STEM and character development. The highlight was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to ask questions of two astronauts on the International Space Station during a live downlink.

Shine On! women don't give up over something like a pandemic getting in our way. They figure it out. They adapt. They find new ways to be successful, and I am so proud of them. This NASA downlink and accompanying virtual conference with almost 30 workshops was the largest event I've ever organized, and the 2021 committee of students did the job of professionals. This event spread the word of Shine On! across the state, country and even out of this world!

From there, we started the new year fresh, excited that schools would be open and life would return. Sadly, our Education Outreach program found itself virtual again as we began planning for a smaller overnight conference for spring 2022 with social distancing requirements. However, this allowed time to more fully develop our Shine On! In-A-Box initiative, which is on the cusp of being trialed with 100 teachers in the next couple of months.

If nothing else, this additional year of the pandemic has taught us to adapt, persevere and thrive in the face of adversity. While we may all need to acknowledge what we've lost, Shine On! women know we can't wallow in "what should have been." My Nana used to say, "shake the crumbs off young lady because the work still needs to get done and just who do you think is going to do it?" We are forever grateful for the continued support from our sponsors and those who've allowed us to continue doing our work.




### Shine On! In-A-Box
